INTRODUCING ... your current Board of Directors Meet the dedicated volunteers who lead TPS President's Message - Troy Libke, PTech



Technology Professionals Saskatchewan(TPS) elected Mr. Troy Libke, PTech, as President at the 60th Annual Meeting held on May 23, 2025. Troy is the Association's 37th President.

Troy became an Associate member in 2007 shortly after his graduation from the Saskatchewan Polytechnic, Moose Jaw campus, Water Resources Engineering

program. In 2009, he was registered as an Applied Science Technologist (AScT), and acquired Professional Technologist (PTech) status in 2024 when the Association changed its professional designation. He serves as a member of TPS' Registration and Examination Boards; represents TPS on water engineering related matters; and at Saskatchewan Polytechnic as a guest speaker and unofficial member-recruiting ambassador. At the national level, he represents Saskatchewan on the Leadership Council for Technology Professionals Canada.

Shortly after Troy graduated in 2006, he immediately began working for Stantec Consulting for 12 years. Troy started out briefly as a Construction Coordinator, then Project Coordinator, and finally as a Project Manager in Stantec's Community Development group. Projects he worked on included the Windsor Park, and Harbour Landing Subdivisions in Regina, as well as numerous other residential, commercial, industrial, and rural residential subdivision developments.

Troy explored new challenges and opportunities in civil engineering and project management, with his position as a Senior Project Manager at Walker Projects – a Division of MBC Engineering Group in Regina. He managed a broad range of civil engineering projects including bridge replacements, First Nations water distribution systems, creek remediations, sanitary sewer and water capacity studies, various water modeling, sewage lagoon expansion, sanitary pumping stations, roadways, airport resurfacing and many other civil projects in the short time he has been with MBC Group. Troy is currently employed with Allnorth Consulting Limited in Regina and is working to grow their office by offering municipal infrastructure and land development services as a Civil Group Lead.

Troy is thankful for the opportunity that has been given to him as President of Technology Professionals Saskatchewan. He plans to continue to build on the many initiatives the TPS board and committee volunteers have started.

TPS is the provincial regulator responsible for the registration and practice of applied science and engineering technology professionals. Established in 1965, the organization grants the professional designations Professional Technologist (PTech), and Certified Technician (CTech), under the "Saskatchewan Applied Science Technologists and Technicians Act", in the following disciplines: Architectural / Building, Bioscience, Chemical, Civil, Computer, Design and Manufacturing, Electrical, Electronics, Engineering Design and Drafting, Environmental, Forestry, Geomatics / Survey, Industrial, Information, Instrumentation, Mechanical, Mining, Petroleum, Telecommunications, and Water Resources.



1st VICE-PRESIDENT Heath Armbruster, PTech

After majoring in Production Design Electronics in Systems Engineering at the University of Regina in the mid-1980s, Heath began his career at the local cable Cable Regina, company, where he worked for six years in diverse roles, including engineering, production, ad creation, technical support,

and Master Control. He ultimately rose to the position of supervisor before transitioning to a teaching career in 1997 at Saskatchewan Polytechnic in the Electronic Communications Technician program. In the same year, Heath became a member of Technology Professionals Saskatchewan, earning the Professional Technologist (PTech) designation.

During his time at Sask Polytech, Heath has played a key role in modernizing curriculum delivery by piloting the transition from Competency-Based to Outcome-Based education and redeveloping courses to establish the Applied Electronics Technician program. Over his 27-year tenure at what is now Saskatchewan Polytechnic, Heath focused on professional development, achieving accreditation to teach the Cisco Certified Networking Associate curriculum within the Computer Networking Technician (CNT) program. His expertise and leadership lead to his appointment the Regional Director for the Cisco Networking Academy Canada's Academy Support Centre for Saskatchewan and northern Alberta, overseeing curriculum delivery across Local Academies.

After 20 years as an instructor, Heath advanced to become the Program Head for the Telecommunications Networking Technician and CNT programs and spearheaded efforts to introduce the Computer Systems Technology program in Regina. In late 2022, he was appointed interim Academic Chair for the School of Information and Communications Technology (ICT). Currently he is leading a team to convert the CNT program into a fully online delivery format, addressing the growing need for flexible and hybrid learning options. Heath has recently completed a global MBA in Educational Leadership.



2nd VICE-PRESIDENT Dave Lenz, PTech

Dave graduated from Saskatchewan Polytechnic Moose Jaw campus Water Resources program in 2004. Following graduation Dave returned to work for the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure (MHI) Regina Laboratory in January of 2005 where he had been a coop student.

As a technologist his duties included various soils tests, asphalt concrete testing and liquid asphalt testing and reporting.

During his career at MHI from 2005 to 2011, Dave supervised the soils area and was responsible for training of new Techs at MHI.

In 2011, Dave joined EBA Engineering (which became Tetra Tech) as the Lab Manager in the Regina office. His responsibilities included asphalt mix design, geotechnical investigations testing and reporting, along with asphalt plant calibration, and training of technologists throughout Saskatchewan. In 2013, the lab was certified by CCIL in asphalt, aggregates, and concrete. Dave was on the first EPS project that returned to Saskatchewan in 2013.

In 2019, he opened his own company Independent Materials Testing Services in Regina. The company conducts asphalt, soils and aggregate concrete testing. Main clients are Regina contractors, several RM's, and engineering firms. The company is CCIL certified as well.

Dave has been married for 27 years to his wife Rae. They have two children Alexandra and Jaxson.

PAST PRESIDENT Frank Van Breugel, CTech

Frank graduated in 1976 from Saskatchewan Polytechnic Moose Jaw campus Industrial Instrumentation program. Following graduation, Frank and his family (wife, son and daughter) moved to British Columbia just north of Fort St. John in 1977.

After a short stint there with Westcoast Transmission Gas recovery and delivery, Frank and his family moved to Saskatoon where he began working at Cominco Potash (now part of the Nutrien group). Four years later, Frank took a job in the Instrumentation program at Sask Polytech. Frank had received his Red Seal Instrument Mechanic Journeyperson status. He began instructing in the Fall of 1983. After a few years, Frank completed a Vocational Technical Education Certificate program through the University of Regina.

In 1990, Frank took on Program Head duties of the Instrumentation programs. After a few years, Frank returned to a full time instructor position. Also noted, Frank signed on to what is now TPS in July 31, 1992. In 2004, Frank once again became Program Head, and remained in that position until his retirement in 2018. Overall, Frank's Instrumentation career spanned 43 years. One key accomplishment that the Program staff achieved was it received National Accreditation status through Technology Accreditation Canada and has retained that status up to the present date.

Through the years, Frank has volunteered to participate in various groups: Excellence in Teaching Awards (formerly initiated by Palliser Campus Faculty Association); Moose Jaw Campus Staff (Social) Club; ASAP (Aboriginal Student Association Participation); ISA (International Society of Automation) Student Advisor. The Instrumentation staff, when Frank was Program Head, had received a very substantial amount of a \$1,000,000 gift in kind from Spartan Controls. This helped immensely in the program to obtain equipment and also improve training for equipment used in the Instrumentation program.

Frank likes to enjoy Duplicate Bridge with the Bridge Club in Moose Jaw. Frank is an avid (sometimes awful) golfer, and looks forward to the challenge of a number of courses. Running has been a big part of his activities. This included a couple of half marathons and one full marathon.




DIRECTOR Tricia Pollock, PTech

Tricia became an Associate member in 1994 after graduating from the Civil Engineering Technology program at Saskatchewan Polytechnic Moose Jaw campus and gained her PTech status in the following years. After spending time with an asphalt company and a small general contractor

at a uranium mine, Tricia joined the City of Saskatoon's Engineering Department. There she learned the inner workings of the municipal infrastructure of the City and later moved into the Public Works Department. In 2004, her career began to take a turn when Tricia enrolled into the University of Saskatchewan extension division and obtained her Occupational Health and Safety Certificate from the University of Alberta. She worked her last four years with the City in the Water and Wastewater Departments as a safety advisor.

Lorne has dedicated his career to the advancement of engineering technology, bridging industry experience with educational leadership. His journey began Saskatchewan Polytechnic in 1990, where he enrolled in the Design and Manufacturing Engineering Technology program. Demonstrating a strong aptitude for the field, he graduated in 1992,

laying the foundation for a diverse and impactful career.

Upon graduation, Lorne joined Northern Telecom, contributing to the IP Connectors and Fiber Engineering Departments. This experience provided him with valuable insights into cutting-edge telecommunications technology. Seeking to apply his skills in a more direct, humanitarian manner, he transitioned to Crestline Coach Ltd. Here, Lorne leveraged his prior training as an Emergency Medical Technician to enhance ambulance design, directly improving the working environment for paramedics and the care provided to patients. His four years at Crestline Coach Ltd. reflected a commitment to practical, real-world applications of engineering technology.

In 1996, Lorne joined Genesis Architecture and Engineering, where he took on a pivotal role in managing the company's CAD systems. He developed and implemented CAD standards, ensuring consistency and efficiency across projects. Notably, he pioneered the implementation of the first file management system utilizing the internet to facilitate collaborative projects among geographically dispersed engineering disciplines. This innovation significantly streamlined workflows and improved project outcomes.

Throughout these years of industry experience, Lorne remained committed to fostering the next generation of technologists. He volunteered on the Program Advisory Committee for the Mechanical Engineering Technology and CAD/CAM Engineering Technology programs at Saskatchewan Polytechnic. His dedication and expertise were recognized in 1998 when he was invited to join the staff of the CAD/CAM Engineering Technology program at Saskatchewan Polytechnic.

In his role as an instructor, Lorne has consistently embraced and implemented emerging technologies, including advanced CAD systems, CAM, 3D printing, and robotics. He has played a crucial role in supervising and participating in numerous applied research projects, providing students with hands-on experience and preparing them for the demands of the modern workforce. Lorne maintains broad and diverse connections with industry and graduates, ensuring a current understanding of industry's evolving needs. This network informs his curriculum and teaching methods, keeping them relevant and aligned with the demands of the modern engineering landscape.

Lorne is a passionate advocate for the Technology Professionals of Saskatchewan (TPS), and its members. He actively encourages students to pursue professional registration, emphasizing the benefits of membership in relevant professional organizations. His commitment to professional standards extends beyond his institution. He has recently been accredited as a lead auditor for Technology Accreditation Canada, where he plays a vital role in ensuring that engineering technology programs across Canada meet the rigorous standards necessary for training competent technologists and technicians.

It is the exclusive domain of registered professional applied science / engineering technologists and certified technicians in Canada. The ring is formed by a repeating pattern of five gears bracketed by a maple leaf on each side. The gears represent the five members of the engineering / design team: trades person, technicians, technologists, engineers, and scientists. The ring is available for purchase to TPS Professional Technologists (PTech), and Certified Technicians (CTech) only.

DIRECTOR Jordan Wicks, PTech

Jordan has been a member of TPS since 2012. Jordan graduated from Saskatchewan Polytechnic with a diploma in Chemical Technology in 2006 and moved to Langenburg to work at Mosaic's Esterhazy potash mine, primarily in the K2 lab. His work at

K2 involved running routine mill samples to verify the mill was running on spec, railcar samples for shipments, water samples from underground on the ICP. Jordan spent two years at Mosaic before moving onto furthering his education.

In 2009, Jordan graduated from Royal Roads University with a B.Sc. in Environmental Science and moved back to Saskatoon to work at the Saskatchewan Research Council (SRC) as a Research Technologist. Jordan worked on and led a variety of projects at SRC including catalyst development for alternative fuels, procurement and operation of a 20 kW gasifier, microbial enhanced oil recovery research, as well as several projects related to

pyrolysis oil and biochar production from agricultural residue. One of the highlights of his work at SRC was using the 20 kW gasifer, running on locally sourced woodchips, to power a recording studio at the Bluegrass Festival in Ness Creek.

In 2018, Jordan began working for Contango Strategies in Saskatoon who's work focused on passive treatment of mining impacted waters prior to release. His work at Contango was primarily based on in-situ field trials as well as development of pilot scale systems for treatment evaluation. He worked at various mines across Canada with the primary focus being the Rainy River Mine and the construction of a 20,000 m3/day water treatment plant.

Jordan then joined ZYUS Life Sciences in 2020 as a Production Supervisor as the company was moving into the final phases of construction. Jordan worked through start-up and establishing routine production in a GMP environment including SOP development, creating protocols for process evaluation, and overseeing and training operators. While at ZYUS, Jordan completed his Master of Science in Civil Engineering from the University of Saskatchewan in 2023. Jordan also moved into his current role of Production Specialist with a focus on developing new and novel processes for new products under the requirements of GMP. Jordan lives in Saskatoon with his wife Leann, and son Jake.
